The Board of Directors Ashoka Refineries Limited

Opinion

- 1. We have audited the accompanying Annual Standalone Financial Results ('the Statement') of Ashoka Refineries Limited ('the Company') for the year ended 31 March 2022, attached herewith, being submitted by the Company pursuant to the requirements of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended) ('Listing Regulations'), including relevant circulars issued by the SEBI from time to time.
- 2. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the Statement:
